Projects

We are pleased to inform that this year Care and Serve Inc supported a number of projects in areas of health and education in poor and / or needy communities in India.

Muni Seva Ashram

We donated \$1,760 (about Rs 100,000) to **Muni Seva Ashram** in Goraj, Dist. Vadodara in Gujarat. Half of this money was to help education of children and the other half was to provide medicines to poor patients being treated in the Muni Seva Ashram hospital.

Muni Seva Ashram runs a number of humanities projects for poor and disadvantaged people in the following areas:

- Education
- Health Care
- Social Welfare
- Sustainable Development

The first two areas education and healthcare are in full alignment with Care and Serve's focus areas.

The President of this Organisation Dr Vikram Patel is considered as one of the most selfless persons in the region and is personally known to one of our committee members Jayendra Shah. Jayendra's friends have personally visited the Ashram and its facilities to check and confirm effective operations before making the decision to support this organisation and its projects.

Rural Medical Society

Care and Serve donated \$1822 (Rs 100,000) to Rural Medical Society in Mahrauli, New Delhi. The Rural Medical Centre treats the patients from the underprivileged section of the society.

One of our committee members, Prof Nihal Agar, visited the Centre and met its Hon Secretary, Dr VK Gopal in 2019 and looked at the wide range of services provided to patients by this organisation.

Dr Gopal assured us that the money will be used for poor outpatients and those requiring treatment for eye diseases such as cataract before making the decision to support this organisation and its projects.

Karma Kitchen

\$500 was donated to a Sydney based organisation **Karma Kitchen** which provides food to homeless people in and around Parramatta.

ACNC Registration and DGR Status

Care and Serve Inc was registered with Australian Charities and Not-Profits Commission (ACNC) in February 2021. In July 2021 we received confirmation from ATO that Care and Serve Inc has been granted DGR status.

This is a significant milestone for Care and Serve as now onwards donations made to Care and Serve Inc can be claimed as tax deductible gifts under Subdivision 30-B of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

We will also make sure that we comply with all the regulatory and other requirements of ACNC and ATO to maintain our ACNC registration and DGR status.
